Help & Healing for Sexual Abuse

Dear ChildSafe,

On a late Saturday evening, the darkest shadow was cast on our family by the news that our child was sexually assaulted by a family member. It was a dagger through my heart. I could not believe what my son was telling me. I was appalled at what my niece had done to my son. All I could do was cry and hug my Patrick. I felt like I had failed to protect him and failed as a mother. After the police came, I took him to CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Children's Hospital where they did a sexual assault exam. As we headed home, my tears turned to anger. More anger than I'd ever felt in my life.

The next few days were the toughest. Patrick felt that he was to blame for what had happened. He didn't want to go to school in fear that SHE—his abuser—would be there. Or her family. He was afraid to tell me that he didn't feel safe and afraid the abuser would be allowed to come into our home again. He was scared to be alone. I was making his favorite sugar cookies and he was frightened to be in the dining room while I was in the kitchen. His fear tore my soul apart.

Then came the day for our forensic interview at ChildSafe. We met a CPS worker and a SAPD detective at ChildSafe. As Patrick went in for the interview, I met with Ricki, our ChildSafe advocate. She explained the process to me and described the services that my son and our family would receive. Then she asked me what happened. The tears came as I talked and Ricki listened. But when we were through I could almost smile and I felt assured that Patrick would get help.

A few weeks later, Patrick had his follow-up medical exam at ChildSafe. The nurse was terrific. She explained what she was doing, and why, and how. When Patrick mentioned to the nurse he was afraid THOSE people might come to ChildSafe, she told him that THOSE people are not allowed to come to ChildSafe. He relaxed, started talking to her, and became comfortable about the process.

Shortly after that we started therapy at ChildSafe. It wasn't easy. But our therapist, Mr. Henry, never forced Patrick to talk. Henry assured Patrick that he wouldn't force him to do anything. That all he wanted to know was Patrick's feelings about what happened. By the third week of therapy, Patrick was in better shape than I was. I know because that was the week Patrick told me it broke his heart to see me cry. He told me he would be okay. So I promised not to cry unless they were happy tears. And it was an easier promise to keep as I saw Patrick recovering. His fear was being replaced by smiles. He could go into a room by himself. And he was talking more about how he felt about what had happened.

We've been going to ChildSafe every week for the past seven months. You have been a Godsend for our family. The healing process takes time and you have never rushed us. I can't imagine going through this without them. ChildSafe has never let us down. You gave me back my son's wonderful personality. You gave him the strength to say "I am a survivor, I am not a victim." Those are the bravest words I've ever heard. And ChildSafe made them possible. Thank you—from my heart—for your care of Patrick and for your care of all the children in the city who need your help.

Volunteer Profile

Kristin Graham is living proof that if you need help with something, you should ask a busy person. Kristin works with another volunteer, Erik Aagaard, as the team that organizes and collects the student art work featured in ChildSafe's annual fundraiser, Art from the Heart.

A little more than three years ago, Kristin was a mortgage broker helping a ChildSafe employee buy a home. It didn't take long for that introduction to involve the entire Graham family with ChildSafe. The first helping hand came as a piece of art from Kristin's husband, Chet, for an auction to benefit ChildSafe. Then Kristin was recruited to help with the student art portion of Art from the Heart.

Kristin's experience with child artists begins at home, where her daughter Jenna, 9, frequently paints alongside Chet. This experience seemed ready-made for Kristin to take charge of the collection of student art. Kristin knew that kids love to create and she enjoyed reaching out to schools to engage teachers and students to make a difference for others.

Attendees at last year's Art from the Heart may have seen Chet and Jenna welcoming kids and adults to make their artistic mark on the "Creative Canvas." Certainly the two of them inspired others to put brush to canvas. At the same event, the student art hanging on the walls of the Blue Star Contemporary Art Center was placed with much time and care by Kristin and other volunteers. It was a great evening, fun for guests and student artists, and raised important funds for ChildSafe.

But there is a much deeper reason that Kristin volunteers for ChildSafe. When she first heard about the number of children who are sexually abused in our community, she was appalled. The "mom" in her knew that something had to be done to help these children. Then one day her volunteer efforts brought Jenna to ChildSafe—and the experience opened a conversation between mother and daughter about child sexual abuse, about staying safe, and about seeking help from a trusted adult.

Today, Kristin's volunteer work brings her in contact with schools and teachers, helps collect 200 to 300 pieces of student art each year, and takes a big hand in making Art from the Heart a successful fundraiser for ChildSafe. She gives two reasons for all her hard work:

- Art from the Heart helps ensure ChildSafe has the funds needed to provide services for the sexually abused children in our community.
- The teachers, students, and parents who take part in the project—kids creating for kids—have the same opportunity she had with Jenna to talk about child sexual abuse. It is more important than Kristin knows. Fewer than 30 percent of the children who come to ChildSafe have ever had such a conversation. The other children never hear about staying safe and seeking help.

In addition to the hours Kristin volunteers for ChildSafe and the many hours she puts in between her home office and her two mortgage offices, she spends time with her family...Chet, Jenna, two horses, two dogs, two cats, and a minnow approaching its second birthday!

Thank you Kristin, for all you do for ChildSafe and for sharing your story with us.

Volunteers at ChildSafe are living proof that many hands make light work. With the able assistance of volunteers, ChildSafe has a beautiful healing and serenity garden, a tidy filing cabinet, special events which run smoothly, and welcoming faces to greet children and families as they enter our waiting room.

What is CARE?

CARE is unique to ChildSafe. Of the 65 children's advocacy centers in Texas, ChildSafe is the only one that has a program that connects children and families with activities designed to help them understand that they should not define themselves as victims—rather as capable individuals.

CARE stands for Child Abuse Resource Enhancement, but it also describes the feelings of ChildSafe staff and our many partners who care about the children we serve. CARE is designed to promote healing, help reduce the likelihood of future high-risk behaviors, and minimize the risk of re-victimization. Our partners also know that many of the activities they provide are fun and that laughter is a step on the path to healing.

CARE provides peer group activities including arts and crafts, sports, music, and more. There are mentoring programs that provide homework assistance and encouragement. Early childhood education provides classes in parenting and childcare. And there are a number of counseling services that work closely with ChildSafe's own counselors and therapists to ensure the children, siblings, and parents/caregivers receive the help they need in the place that is most convenient for the family.

Looking Ahead

THE TIMES ARE CHANGING

The current state of the economy has placed nonprofit organizations in the bull's-eye for funding cuts. There is increased pressure for nonprofit organizations to show that their programs are effective and cost efficient.

While funders are requesting more accountability for nonprofits there is a continued increase for the need for more services within the San Antonio community. Staff productivity and efficiency are now as important as client relationships to funding sources. Successful nonprofits must operate as well-organized businesses. The challenge for ChildSafe, and all human service nonprofits, is to operate as a proficient business while maintaining personal connectedness and premium care to our clients.

Historically, program evaluations from nonprofits have focused on the number served within a target population. A successful program can now be calculated by measurable outcomes that are consistent over time and can be replicated. Although ChildSafe has always done an excellent job of assessing children and their families throughout their course of care to assist our team with meeting their needs, we have never used the assessment data as a tool for program evaluation. Program evaluation is a shift in culture for ChildSafe. Our programs have traditionally focused on counting outputs rather than achieving measurable outcomes. ChildSafe wants to focus on interventions that help clients achieve their goals. With our shift to outcome based programs, program managers are being tasked to work with staff to identify current therapeutic techniques and interventions that are evidence based. Evidence based interventions have been researched and have shown to be effective. ChildSafe has recently applied and was accepted to be part of a learning collaborative to train therapists on Trauma Focused Cognitive Behavior Therapy, an evidence based therapeutic service for children and their families.

In order for ChildSafe to measure outcomes and increase our efficiency, we must have the means and tools to do so. In March of this year the Board approved the purchase of Efforts to Outcomes (ETO) software by Social Solutions. This software will provide the tools to measure demographics, monitor staff utilization/outputs, and measure client outcomes. ChildSafe began working with Social Solutions on software development in May, and completion of development is scheduled for this week. During this time program managers have been asked to develop logic models for all their current programs in order to determine measurable outcomes for each program. Program managers have also been asked to complete program specific policies and procedures. Once staff have been trained and working on ETO there is an expectation of software proficiency by January 1, 2012. By July of 2012 ChildSafe will have its first real look at concrete data for outcomes for those served by our current programs.

This is an exciting time for ChildSafe and its programs as we continue to build upon ChildSafe's history and foundation. More to come!




